PASTORS MESSAGE

I write on the Wednesday prior to the Fifth Sunday in Lent, March 14, 2018. Because Lent began early in our church liturgical cycle, Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter are upon us. Several interims back, here in Penn Central Conference and in the Lebanon Association, I noted a term in my pastor's newsletter article. It was a term I had no knowledge of until moving to Harrisburg in 2000. The term is Triduum. I discovered that triduum denotes a three-day period of prayer, usually in preparation for an important feast or in celebration of that feast. Triduum also recalls the three days that Christ spent in the tomb, from Good Friday until Easter Sunday.

Of course, the best-known triduum is the Paschal or Easter Triduum, which begins with the service of the Lord's Supper on the evening of Holy Thursday and continues until the start of second vespers (evening prayer) on Easter Sunday. Triduum is also known as (when capitalized) Paschal Triduum, Holy Triduum, or Easter Triduum. I can recall coming to Central Pennsylvania in 2000 to serve a congregation in Midtown Harrisburg. During the almost seven years I served Second UCC Harrisburg I volunteered as a chaplain at both Harrisburg Hospital and Holy Spirit Hospital. Sister Margaret was the Roman Catholic religious nun at the head of the spiritual care department at Holy Spirit Hospital. My second Lenten and Easter season, I happened to be on-call chaplain making visits to persons in the ER who had indicated a desire to see a chaplain. After my visits, I met Sister Margaret back in the pastoral care office while picking up my coat. Sister asked: "And how will you be spending The Triduum, Rev. Beynon?" I said: "The what?" She said the Triduum? To my blank stare she said: "...Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter?" I confessed my ignorance of the term and we both chuckled a little.

The life giving bread of life and cup of the fruit of the vine are the elements in the Sacrament of the table instituted on Maundy Thursday. In 1982, The World Council of Churches based in Geneva, Switzerland published a seminal or highly influential document which had been used by the churches of all varied historic backgrounds. This document is entitled Baptism, Eucharist, and Ministry. Let me encourage us all to study this formative and critically important document almost as carefully and reverently as we might a passage of the Bible. I say this because BEM by The World Council of Churches was the earliest ecumenical document and begin a movement our denomination led and continues to lead in this new century.

Maundy Thursday, the first day of the Triduum, is described by the World Council of Churches BEM Document as follows:

PASTORS MESSAGE (cont'd)

"The last meal celebrated by Jesus was a liturgical meal employing symbolic words and actions. Consequently the Eucharist is a sacramental meal which by visible signs communicates to us God's love in Jesus Christ, the love by which Jesus loved his own "to the end" (John13:1). It has acquired many names: for example, the Lord's Supper, the breaking of bread, the Holy Communion, the Divine liturgy, the mass. Its celebration continues as the central act of the Church's worship."

Inherent and also quite explicit in the three days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter is this succinct yet powerfully spiritual affirmation of faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. Especially as Shiloh finds and affirms the faith necessary for the search and call of the next settled minister during this interim period, I hope you will gather on the three most consequential days of the church calendar. These days are the profound center and the actions of we who follow the Lamb of God, Jesus our Savior and Lord.

May we gather and bless the name of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Pastor's Report -Pastor Mike reviewed how the small group discussion process and data gathering will work during the visioning sessions that will be held in the near future. We will be scheduling numerous times to meet with the congregation including days, evenings and weekends - stay tuned and please plan on attending one of these very important sessions that will help determine the future of Shiloh UCC. On May 6th, during the Sunday School hour, Consistory members will meet with the Confirmands for an informal meeting time.

Church and Ministry- A candidate has been found for the office staff/ job share position. Following a motion, Consistory voted to hire Maira Rivera, pending approved clearances.

Outreach and Evangelism- Consistory approved adding Friends of Limon to the "Amazon Cares" program.

Youth- The 24 hour fast went well. 20 Youth attended from 3 different churches.

Worship and Ministry- Butterfly Sunday will take place on April 8.

Stewardship- Will be submitting a grant request through Community Aid for monies to go towards the new proposed HVAC system. Quotes for the project will need to be obtained by early July as the Community Aid grant submission date is in July.

Christian Education- The Sunday School Lenten offering will be used to support Heifer project this year. There will not be a mother/daughter banquet this year.

New Business- Consistory approved the request to place a box in the narthex for the Lion's Club to collect used eye glasses. Sue Long and Sandy Barnes have resigned from Cherub Choir. The York Association Leadership Banquet will be held on Sunday, April 22 at the Wyndham Garden York. Deadline for reservations and meal selection is Sunday, April 15th.

First, a report of our education outreach, we are so thankful to all who are supporting this ministry as we are seeing changes in the lives of children, youth, young adults, and single mothers. They say a picture is worth a thousand words and so I present to you some of our graduates for 2017. We had 6 graduate from Kindergarten, 3 sixth grade, 1 ninth grade, 1 high school, and we are very proud of our son Crosby Jr. who graduated with a Masters in Pharmacy.



Graduations took place in December 2017, at the end of the school year. We began the new school year in February with a total of 105 students from Kindergarten through University receiving back pack supplies thanks to your generous donations through Hearts and Hands for Jesus and Friends of Limon. YES! We are seeing change! We have 4 students currently in university!

Some of the young adults of the church helped my sister, Sue Crone, and I to pack the bags which we distributed at the church and in the community.

These bags are more than supplies, these are bags of hope and encouragement to many economically disadvantaged families.


