PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Hope for the Journey

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Romans 15:13

Spring is all about hope. In springtime, we see the whole earth regenerate. This massive annual regeneration reminds us of the new life we find in Christ. When we have a spiritual awakening, when we are born again, we see everything in a new light. The sadness of depression leaves us, and we feel a natural enthusiasm for life. Spring holds that potential. It can infuse us with hope because the beautiful flowers remind us of God' eternal promise to renew us. 
