PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,

I will fear no evil;

For You are with me;

Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me."

(Psalm 23:4 New King James Version)

Dear Friends of Shiloh UCC,

Sometimes, pastors go through dark times. No human being is immune to suffering. Even ministers walk through "the valley of the shadow of death." When a pastor suffers, all you can do, is pray for them. Trust me. They are very grateful for your prayers and support. As many of you know it by now, my Mom passed away on January 16th, so it's difficult for me to write uplifting and comforting words. However, I can tell you what comforts me when I'm in a dark place.

With the psalmist's words, I can say, "I will fear no evil, for You are with me..." I know that God is with me through good and bad times. It's also comforting to know, that one day I will see my beloved Mother on the other side. She lives in my heart, wanting me to have a good and happy life. My husband, Tank, is truly my strength through this grief, and even my little Sophia tries to comfort me her own way. I cannot say enough about all the kind words that I still receive through Facebook, emails, phone calls, cards and flowers. I look at all these expressions of love and care as love letters come down from God, through angel wings, straight from Heaven.

The Bible says that God is love. And February is all about love. I wish all of you the experience of love. Don't be afraid to show your love toward others, and humbly accept the love that others want to gift to you. There are many types of love, but I believe they all come from God. The source of pure love is God... for "God is love." (1John 4:8). I know that many of you are going through hard times, because of illnesses, grief or other problems. I want you to know that you are not alone. Your Pastor cares about you, and what's even more important, God loves you.

When dark times knock on your door, open your Bible. My "go to" book in the Bible is the Book of Psalms. Most people's favorite psalm is psalm 23. However, even if you just randomly read a psalm, God will speak through its words. This book is so rich in poetry, beautiful images, comfort, history, and deep human feelings. I can only encourage you to read it over and over again.

I can never get tired of reading the Psalms. There is always a new message in there waiting for you. All you have to do is open your Bible and let God speak to you.

If your life is joyful, fulfilled and happy at this time, I hope you remember to thank God for all your blessings. Remember to be grateful and maybe even reach out to others who need some comforting. Regardless if you are happy or sad, if you are on a mountain of joy or in the valley of death, I wish all of you a blessed, love filled February.

It's a bit ironic that Valentine's Day this year is also Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. It's a reminder that life is not all love and happiness. For those who are sad and suffering, this is a reminder that life is not all "Lent," grief and sadness. On the ups and downs of life, God is with us, crying and smiling with us, for the Holy Spirit lives in our heart. No matter where you are on life's journey, no matter if you are happy or sad, you can find comfort in the words of the psalm writer, and say it with him: "I will fear no evil; For You are with me..."

EARLY LEARNING CENTER ANNUAL REPORT

Our Mission Statement says that "Shiloh UCC Early Learning Center exists to provide a foundation for success in Kindergarten and beyond to two, three, four, and five-year-old preschoolers in a caring Christian environment." To achieve this, our curriculum has been carefully designed to provide social, physical, and emotional growth. There is freedom to explore ideas, ask questions, develop positive relationships, and begin to learn individual and group problem solving. Creative expression is nurtured through music and art. Finally, many finger plays, songs, and both gross and fine motor activities take place during the pre-school day.

The 2022-23 school year began our 46th year of educating children at Shiloh UCC ELC. We were fully enrolled with over 180 children. We were blessed to have most staff returning as well as three new ladies joining our ELC teaching family. Our Enrichment program continued allowing our children to enjoy a longer day here at school. We were able to enjoy field trips to Smyser's Farm, Brown's Orchard, West Manchester Fire Station, and Pumpkin Hill. Our ELC families enjoyed a Fall Festival and Parent's Night Out compliments of the amazing Church Chums group. Lastly our four's classes enjoyed precious time in the Sanctuary with Pastor Melinda and the three's classes received a beautiful Bible from the members of Shiloh UCC.

The second half of the 2022-23 school year was equally as amazing. We continued with fun activities and programs such as pajama day, dental lessons; compliments of the Children's Dental Centre and Dr. Seuss dress up days and funny dramas. During healthy heart month our four's students enjoyed bowling with their preschool friends and teachers. ELC Sunday was incredibly special as the children performed many songs followed by delicious refreshments provided by the Church members. Our school year ended with Spring Programs and an extremely exciting Fun Day.

Summer at the Early Learning Center was very enjoyable. We offered three successful summer camps. Our Jungle themed camp took place in May.
