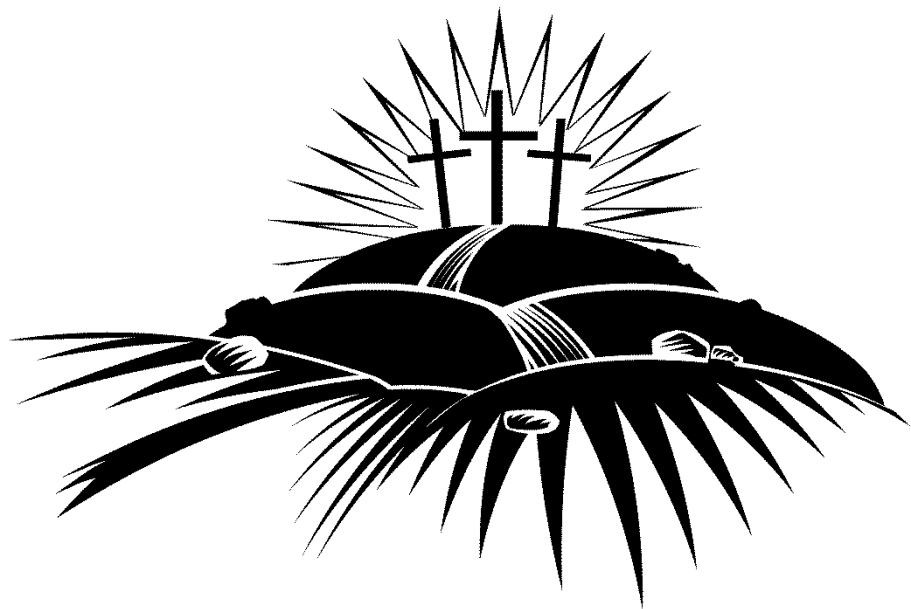

## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

As you receive this issue of the Communique, Lent is well under way. March has long been my favorite time of both the seasonal year and the church year. The truism is often stated, March "comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb." And the truth be known, March is often filled with both weather and spiritual experiences which express the characteristics of both lions and lambs! For example, how often are the daffodils of March covered with the late snows of the waning winter? I've heard such snows called "onion snow" as the onions are said to be sweetened by the snow. Spiritually speaking, the Lenten and Palm/Passion Sunday Bible texts are chock full of reversals, paradoxes, lambs that turn into lions and lions that turn into lambs. Lent calls us to prayerful reflection in all aspects of our life. And why is this? That our lives might yield to the ongoing transformation that only God's living Spirit can accomplish.

Overall it is universally found in Christian spirituality, human strength is discovered to be in reality, an obvious failure to follow Jesus, the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world. For example, Pilate asks "What is truth" in chapter 18:37 of John's Gospel: <sup>37</sup> Pilate asked him, 'So you are a king?' Jesus answered, 'You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.' <sup>38</sup> Pilate asked him, 'What is truth?'"

The month of March and our journey through Lent presents only two options to each and all followers of The Lamb of God. These two are very technically called projection and introjection. In the quote above from Chapter 18 of the Gospel of John, Pilate hears Jesus saying something about the truth in an exterior or outward way. Pilate hears Jesus out of his own outward identity as a Roman governor answerable to the Roman Emperor. Pilate is an agent of the Pax Romanum; the Peace of Roman maintained by Roman power and the force of the spear, sword and crucifixion.

Jesus isn't speaking about the Roman authority backed by armed force. Where Jesus speaks of truth, he means the spiritual and inward communion with God in prayer, scripture and living faith traditions. Jesus speaks of how these outward actions of praying, spiritual reading of scripture and living religious tradition speak truth within the person; within the heart and soul. Lent is totally concerned with taking our year past and current life before the Lamb of God. We have lived an additional year and thus have more events and more new experiences to place before our prayer, our study of scripture and our engagement with the living tradition of the faith of Jesus Christ, redeemer, creator and Holy Spirit.

## PASTOR'S MESSAGE (cont'd)

James Russell Lowell was an American Poet, Critic, Essayist, Editor and Diplomat, who lived through most of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century, 1819-1891. Lowell used poetry to express his anti-slavery views and took a job in Philadelphia, as the editor of an abolitionist newspaper. James R. Lowell, in the Boston Courier, December 11, 1845 wrote these words as a poem protesting America's war with Mexico:

"Once to every man and nation, comes the moment to decide, In the strife of truth with falsehood, for the good or evil side;  
Some great cause, some great decision, offering each the bloom or blight, And the choice goes by forever, 'twixt that darkness and that light."  
And here, in the words of Lowell is one the most clear, spiritual, how to descriptions of the Lenten journey: "New occasions teach new duties, time makes ancient good uncouth, They must upward still and onward, who would keep abreast of truth."

Therefore, Lent calls us to new devotions of prayer, spiritual reading of the Holy texts and to prayerful engagements with the living traditions of the Christian faith. Need I say, that such intentional spiritual discipline is the core of our Church's inward and spiritual reflection in this time called the interim period?

Hope to see you in church and in conversation about the works of faith Shiloh is called to accomplish in our future life together.  
May God indeed bless us with the strength and disciplines that we, paraphrasing Lowell, 'might upward still and onward, to keep abreast of God's truth.'

## FEBRUARY CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

Guest Zoe D'heedene presented her report entitled "Zoe D'heedene's Faith Journey". The Consistory approved reaffirming our support of Zoe as a Student in Discernment at Shiloh UCC. Zoe will submit an update for the Communique on a quarterly basis.

**Pastor's Report** – Pastor Mike discussed the small group questions and process design. He proposed that Shiloh UCC host several small group discussion sessions. The process is to gather all the data from congregants, leaders, PCC, and York Association about Shiloh. Then find person or persons with good writing skills to fill in the blanks on the UCC Profile form. Get the Profile written and voted on by congregation.

**Church and Ministry**- Norina Bentzel reported on the progress that has been made regarding replacing Cookie Rains. The Job Share has been posted and advertised.

**Finance**- All financial statements have been sent. An increase to the envelope cost/offset (initial) from \$3.00 to \$5.00 will be made. There has not been an increase request for 12 years.

**Property**- Awaiting quotes for several different options regarding the HVAC system. The boiler is 46 years old. Its life expectancy was 25 years. Also addressed are the thermostat controls, noting that some are antiquated and some are the new programmable type. A spreadsheet report of items that have been/ will be addressed by the Work Crew was submitted.

**Outreach and Evangelism**- Consistory approved the offering designation for Ash Wednesday, Lent, Maundy Thursday and Easter as follows: 1/3 to Mr. Sandy's Veteran Shelter and Safe Haven Drug Rehab, 1/3 to Shiloh UCC Building Fund and 1/3 to the Van Fund for missionaries Sally Jane and Crosby Johnson.

**Youth**- The 24 hour fast will be at the end of February. The committee will meet to determine how best to approach young members to get them interested in participating in the life of our church.

**Worship and Ministry**- Lenten Supper to be held at Shiloh UCC on March 7. Locust Grove UCC will be providing part of the meal.

**Pastoral Care and Visitation**- Pastor Mike visited 9 people and the visitation team visited 11 people. A big concern this year is the flu virus.

**ELC**- Several classes with openings for next year. The ELC is re-evaluating their snow cancellation policy. The ELC families provided Christmas gifts to several families in need.

**Christian Education**- Children's Day is being cancelled due to a lack of participation.

Monetary donations will be collected beginning Sunday, **February 18** through Easter Sunday, **April 1**. Your support is greatly appreciated!



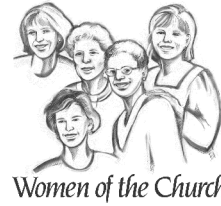

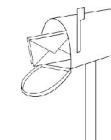
