PASTOR'S MESSAGE



"This is the one we acknowledge and adore – one God in a Trinity of the sacred name." (Confession,)

Dear Members and Friends of Shiloh UCC,

St. Patrick's Day is coming, and I thought it would be nice to remember who this saint was, and what he did. You must have heard some stories of how he drove the snakes out of Ireland, defeated fierce Druids in contests of magic, and how he used the shamrock to explain the Trinity to the pagan Irish.

Patrick used the shamrock with its three leaves to explain the Trinity. How do church members understand the Trinity in modern times? I know it's not Trinity Sunday yet - Trinity Sunday this year is May 26th - but let's meditate for a moment on who these three mysterious persons are, and how they exist in unity in one God. Understanding the Trinity can be a bit challenging, even for theologians.

The most basic explanation of the Holy Trinity, of course after St. Patrick's shamrock, is the image of water. Water is a fluid in room temperature, freezes when it's gets cold, and becomes a vapor when heated above the boiling point. Water, like the Trinity, can be three things, but unlike the Trinity, it cannot be those three things simultaneously, at all places and times. Still, this limited analogy, is the best way we can talk about the three persons of the immortal and invisible God. The most classical way describing the persons of the Trinity is through the traditional words: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE (Cont'd)

However, there are other approaches to the persons of the Trinity. We also call them Creator, Christ, and Holy Spirit, or Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer. The list could go on, but let's not focus on what words we use to name the persons of the Trinity. None of these words get at the nature of God; for God is beyond language.

Understanding God's persons is not as important as knowing in our soul that God loves us and will help us through all our problems. Mortals cannot understand God. But one day, when this life is over, we will run into our Heavenly Father's arms, like a young child runs to their Daddy.

And our Heavenly Father will remove the veil that hides all these mysteries from our awareness. Our faith grants us courage to accept the epistemological limits of human reason, and to rest in the Divine love and benevolent care of our Father in Heaven.

Let me finish this short meditation with a blessing written by St. Patrick:

"May the strength of God pilot us, may the wisdom of God instruct us, may the hand of God protect us, may the word of God direct us. Be always ours this day and for evermore."

I wish all of you a sunny and beautiful March and a happy and healthy St. Patrick's Day!


