PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"For we live by faith, not by sight." (2 Corinthians 5:7, NIV)

Dear Friends in Christ,

As the days of the year get darker, we need inner light to keep our soul from becoming discouraged. We need God's light to lift us up and carry us through the dark days. We need God's immortal invisible light to redeem us, and warm our soul, until the physical light of the sun returns to its fullness again. We need the light of God, the spiritual nourishment we receive in church, because it gives us faith to live, not by sight, but by the grace of the Holy Spirit.

Our quote for November comes from 2 Corinthians chapter 5, where, like a good preacher, Paul comforts the Christians in Corinth. In chapters 4 and 5 he explains that at this time, while we are in these physical bodies, we don't have full knowledge. We don't understand why things happen the way they do. We fully depend on God. We will only understand God's mysterious will and the "why-s" of this life when the "Parousia" comes, at the end of this age, when Jesus Christ returns. Until then, as long as we are in these "earthen vessels" (2 Cor. 4:7, NKJV), we don't see the full picture. However, as always, Paul sends encouragement to the Christians in Corinth with these words:

"Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day." (2 Cor. 4:16, NIV)

These words encourage me and everyone else who is going through trying times. Even though we may suffer, even though we may go through illnesses and problems associated with these bodies, in spite of this material suffering, spiritually "we are being renewed" by the Holy Spirit. This gives us strength to go on living, even when our circumstances are less than ideal. It gives us faith to live in the comfort of God's grace.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE (Cont'd)

Inner strength can only come from God. Spiritual growth happens when we remain joyful and keep the faith, even when the world appears unjust and cruel. No matter what the outer manifestation, the Devil has no power over our souls. Evil may want to hurt us physically or emotionally, but in the end "every knee will bow" before Jesus Christ. (Philippians 2:10 NIV)

Satan has no power over the soul. When we ask Jesus to come into our hearts, we are protected. When outside circumstances are trying, we Christians can place our worry and anxiety at the foot of the cross. If you are going through difficulties in your personal, work, or spiritual life, turn to God. Live in the protective arms of the Most High. Your God is an awesome God, with power to deliver you from suffering.

When we are weak, the power of the Almighty One becomes apparent. It brings a joy and peaceful resignation that the world cannot perceive. Though they have eyes, they do not see. Though they have ears, they cannot hear. The world cannot hear the delightful song of the soul, that God is singing, just for you. Give your life to Jesus, so that your name can be written in the Book of Life, and so that you will be saved, and can begin to hear the song the angels are singing.

Remember what the Apostle Paul said to the Corinthians, and find joy in the midst of trouble:

"For we live by faith, not by sight." (2 Corinthians 5:7, NIV)
