PASTOR'S NOVEMBER MESSAGE

Warm Fall Greetings on this 17th day of October! I'm writing today looking ahead to the November scripture lessons and attendant themes suggested by these monthly texts of the Revised Common Lectionary. I receive a clear, unmistakable message behind them all which I believe centers on the response of gratitude to God's saving work in Jesus Christ. Let me say more by way of explanation.

Gratitude enters the scene on the first Sunday of November. This Sunday is traditionally the Sunday of All Saints. All Saints is the Sunday that the Church recognizes the power of Jesus resurrection life inspiring a life of faith in the abundant life Christ gives to all creation. The gospel text from John details Jesus raising of Lazarus from the dead. On November 11th and 18th through the twelfth and thirteenth chapters of Mark we hear Jesus lifting up the values of humility and communion with God at all times and places, especially when the days are dark and filled with chaos and strife.

The month of November, in the Revised Common Lectionary, ends with The Reign of Christ Sunday. On November 25th we both remember and look forward to what in fact we live each day in the present; the constant presence of the One in whom we see the very face of and life of God. I hope you'll take it upon yourself to read and ponder in your hearts the texts for this month of November.

November also brings the clear and present needs of our Shiloh faith community into very clear focus. Especially during this interim and transitional time, everything we do together prepares the way for the next settled, permanent minister. This means that, without a doubt, your church needs you and your daily prayers. Shiloh needs you connected to the daily and every Sabbath worship. Shiloh needs your prayers, your participation and most of all your presence.

I believe there is no place as apt to experience the gratitude of faith in Christ that leads to life changing results spoken of in the November scripture lessons than the numbers of persons committed to this faith community. There are very real and present challenges. What gets me up and going every morning is the sole source and goal of our faith; the Lord Jesus Christ dwelling within each of us by the agency of The Holy Spirit God. "We need you" those powerful WWII posters once stated in unambiguous reference to the US engagement in the second world war. Similarly, Shiloh needs each and every one of the congregation to gather together to strengthen our faith in the One in whom we life and move and have our being." Acts 17:28.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE (cont'd)

Please note the linkage I'm making between gratitude and thanksgiving for what Christ continues to do for us and with us. This gratitude should and must be linked with our own response in self-examination, soul searching, repentance, and opening ourselves to the transforming power of God's Holy Spirit. God's Spirit heals and unifies our lives each day we allow it to.

May we celebrate our thanksgiving and gratitude for God's Holy Spirit each day in the month of November. May we be entirely ready and humbly ask for God's transforming power in our lives. May you strengthen your faith in God by joining with your church, Shiloh United Church of Christ more regularly and more often.

And most of all, please pray for the profile committee, and the soon to be called search committee. Let us gather together to strengthen one another. Amen!

OCTOBER CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

President's Report – Tim reported that he has a list of names of people willing to be on the "Profile" and "Search and Call" Committees. At this time, the list includes: Tim Bentzel, Jane Harrison, Brad Jacobs, Sally Curren, Shirley Lohmann, Kaitlin Rentzel, Patti Goodyear, Linda Little, Cheryl Hershey, Joyce Mummert, Nathan Limbert, Jessie Sechriest and Steve Besecker.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Mike noted that Rev. Dr. Monica Dawkins Smith, Conference Minister and President of the Penn Central Conference, will be supporting the search for our next settled minister, including reviewing the final profile, and meeting with the Consistory and Search Committee throughout the process.

Church and Ministry- The Nominating Committee will have 5 Consistory slots to fill (4 full term, and 1 open position). Staff reviews have been completed.

Finance- The Stewardship Challenge Fund to date has collected over \$5,000.00 for the Boiler Fund. There was discussion regarding ongoing deficit in current funds collected year to date. The Consistory is taking every measure possible to control our costs. The building loan balance stands at \$68, 509.49.

OCTOBER CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS (cont'd)

Communication and Technology- The newly donated computers have arrived. The current parsonage tenant has offered to assist with setting them up.

Property- The boiler project is 90% complete at this time.

Church Life- A fundraiser for the boiler fund to be held at Isaac's Restaurant on October 23.

Outreach and Evangelism- The next CREW mission trip will take place in July 2020.

Youth- The Youth will be hosting "Trunk or Treat" on October 28, in the church parking lot.

Pastoral Care and Visitation- There were 13 visits for 11 people during the past month.

ELC- The ELC will be hosting 2 events next month. A Kindergarten Awareness Program with teachers and administrators from many area elementary schools speaking about Kindergarten Readiness and Awareness on October 29. The second event will be a seminar about child abuse on November 7.

Christian Education- In an effort to accommodate all Sunday School students, there will be 2 Youth Sunday School class times offered. One class will meet during the Church Service Hour, and the other will meet during the Sunday School Hour.

New Business- Consistory voted to give 100% of the Thanksgiving offering to the Dover Food Bank. Consistory voted to designate the Christmas offering as follows: \$100.00 to Shiloh Fire Co., \$500.00 to Bell Family Shelter, and the remaining going to the Current Fund.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hi Everyone, I wanted to take this opportunity to update you on the progress of our Church's profile. As I previously mentioned, I attended a Search and Call Conversations seminar at the Lancaster Theological Seminary in September which provided a wealth of information regarding best practices for the search and call process, one of which is to have a separate profile team complete our profile. I received 12 volunteers from the congregation, including Steve Besecker; Sally Curren; Patti Goodyear; Jane Harrison, Cheryl Hershey; Brad Jacobs; Nathan Limbert; Linda Little; Shirley Lohman; Joyce Mummert; Kaitlin Rentzel; Jessie Sechreist and we began to meet in October and are meeting every other week in hopes to complete the profile in the next few months. This is an aggressive goal however, you may recall we completed our last profile in 2013 so this is a good start which we hope will expedite this process.

I understand the importance and necessity of completing the profile, and ultimately searching and calling our next settled minister in a timely manner, however this process takes careful consideration and discernment. Unfortunately some see this time as a waste and are not willing to support this process and worse yet are leaving Shiloh UCC when we need them the most. Please reach out to them and let them know they are missed and that a lot of people are working hard to make Shiloh UCC a better place for the future.

I too am disheartened by our declining attendance; by the lack of younger families and children running up the aisles; by the empty Sunday School classrooms; by the deficit; and by the sadness in our congregation. But I also have hope that God has a plan; that God will provide and that God is still speaking!!

These are difficult and challenging times for Shiloh UCC, but they can also be exciting and rewarding times, if we pull together and pray together. I came across this Litany below which helps comfort me and I hope it will help comfort you too.



The ELC had a very busy month of October. The 3 year old and 4 year old classes walked to the Shiloh Fire Station and learned about Fire Safety. We put our knowledge into action by participating in a school wide fire drill. The boys and girls did an excellent job walking safely to our

“meeting place”. Forsight Vision conducted vision screenings for our three and four year old students. In the past, this fantastic service has given insight to many families that resulted in visiting their optometrist and getting corrective lenses. We embraced the cooler weather and the beauty of autumn, learned about scarecrows, pumpkins, germs, and nocturnal animals. Finally, we celebrated this season with two exciting seasonal events. On October 28th, the ELC families were invited to Trunk or Treat in the Shiloh UCC parking lot. We are always so grateful to be included in this festive and very fun activity. Then each class, with help of many parents, celebrated with a fall festival complete with costumes, snacks and fun activities.

The ELC has opened our doors at night to host two Parent Nights. The first took place in October and it was entitled *Pathway to Kindergarten*. During this evening we invited teachers and principals from our surrounding school districts to participate in a panel discussion about preparing for kindergarten. ADVENT



For most of the unchurched world and even many Christians unfamiliar with the liturgical year, there may be some confusion surrounding the meaning of the Advent season. Some people may know that the Advent season focuses on expectation and think that it serves as an anticipation of Christ's birth in the season leading up to Christmas. This is part of the story, but there's more to Advent. Today, the season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. At that time, the new Christian year begins with the twelve-day celebration of Christmastide, which lasts from Christmas Eve until Epiphany on January 6. (Advent begins on Sunday that falls between November 27th and December 3rd each year.) In this light, the Advent hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" perfectly represents the church's cry during the Advent season: O come, O come, Emmanuel, And ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here Until the Son of God appears. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.
